The Fellowship of the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts is one of the oldest Alumni art nonprofit organizations in America and staffed solely by volunteers, which speaks of the impressive loyalty and dedication of our Board and Advisors.

We are an independent entity, with its sole purpose to benefit all PAFA Alumni.

On Monday evening, April 19, 1897, approximately five hundred people met in the Pennsylvania Academy lecture room to form an organization of alumni that would come to be known worldwide as The Fellowship of the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts. They came together at the behest of Edward H. Coates, President of PAFA, and Harrison S. Morris, Managing Director. The idea had been endorsed by 32 prominent artists. Robert Vonnoh, a former student and later Academy instructor, suggested that a notice be sent to several thousand alumni.

After 128 years the Fellowship is still going strong and is proud to celebrate this year's Annual Exhibition *Circle of Gems* at the Box Spring Gallery from November 13 through December 13, 2025. Gallery owner, Gaby Heit served as our Juror, and selected the art and the awards. All works are for sale.

This year's exhibition is composed of 51 works all by Academy Alumni in many mediums and styles. Our Fellowship virtual gallery will also have the works for sale until the middle of February. **Michael Gallagher** Academy alumni, will be giving a **gallery talk** on **Thursday**, **December 11**, **2025** at Box Spring.

Thank you **Gaby Heit**, for helping another Annual to be one of our best. I personally thank our **Fellowship Board of Directors and Advisors** who help make our organization a great support for PAFA Alumni year-round. We all thank, Mostafa Darwish, our *Virtual Gallery Director*, and Nicole Maye Luga for their work on our virtual exhibitions year-round.






